WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY IN DERBY

It will doubtless come as a little surprise to many readers to know that in the midst of Derby we have half a dozen amateur wireless telegraph stations AT which messages are received daily from quite distance stations

Interest in the subject seems to have been aroused by Mr. Bailey's University Extension lectures in the spring of last year, and enquires have elicited the information that we have a "wireless" club in Derby, with, headquarters and an "aerial" over Mr. Brigdens premises in Irongate. The outward and visible sign of ether stations may easily be discerned, one on the Kedleston Road, one on St Marys Gate, two on Uttoxeter Road, one in Junction Street, and another out Littleover way. These all hold the Postmaster Generals Licence and have distinctive "call signs" allotted to them. There is also a portable station belonging to the Derwent Troop of Boy Scouts.
